

Zionist history

How they got in Palestine

In 1896 the Jewish journalist Theodor Herzl was looking for a solution for the persecution Jewish people were facing in Europe , Ironically enough the first solution he came up with is for all Jews to become Christians so they merge into societies but he knew this would fail as people will still despise them even if they got high ranks in society, That lead him to think that the only solution for Jews to live peacefully is to make a home for Jews or as he called it "The state of Jew" that's built for people that are ethnically Jew , in 1897 he held the first Zionist conference and the main picks were Uganda , Argentina and Palestine , Argentina was the main choice for them in The Jewish State book there is a brief section titled "Palestine or Argentina?" where he was extremely convinced by moving to Argentina. Herzl did not become attached to the notion that there has to be a Jewish homeland reestablished in Palestine until he got involved with eastern European Zionists, who were attached to the biblical Land of Israel, and set up what became the Zionist Organization. Using their claimed heritage in Palestine helped convincing some to .believe in the idea of **zionism**

At the end of the 19th and the beginning of the 20th century, the land of Palestine was a complete community with a Muslim majority , a good amount of Christians and a 5-7% percent of jews , Yafa for example was a big city it had around 60k Palestinian with cinemas , theaters and a seaport older than Tel Aviv one with hundreds of years, the Palestine exploration fund done by UK in 1871 till 1877 made a documentary about Palestine and names a site of 13k places in it , then the immigration started , us Arabs and the ottomans didn't have problems with jews coming at first because our religion teaches us to allow them living under our ruling not how Europeans were kicking jews around and abusing them , then Chaim Weizmann the Jewish who knew nothing about his religion started a company to buy lands from to give to jews, but Palestinians refused and ofc he failed , as the professor Walter Lehn said it's an agricultural community so they refused to sell their land for money as this land was their life ,especially because the deal contained kicking those Arab from their land , that's why Israel will only be able to buy from large absentee land lords for example one of the Lebanese families who lived in Europe and owned 200k kilometers square and sold them in Marj ibn 'Amir , then what the jews did was basically : three things

- 1 refusing to collaborate with Palestinians
- 2 guarding the land for example Hashumer forces
- 3 boycotting Palestinians economically

Then before WW1 the number of Jews in Palestine
.raised from 24k to 50k

This was very frustrating for Theodore Hertzl as he wanted to make the process much faster , so he went to Britain, jews at the time were 50k , but Palestinians were 500k so and this according to Zionism ideology was wrong, as they have a concept that any land they are a minority in they will be abused Then Chaim Weizmann and Theodore Hertzl went to Britain proposing the idea of them investing in their Zionist project as it will be helpful for their ambition in the east concerning controlling it and Suez channel, you see Britain had a colony in India and Suez channel was the only passage to their so this project looked nice to them , adding to this the billions Rothschild family gave to Britain in WW1 and they weapons Weizmann gave them they accepted ,then Britain started helping the Jewish immigrating to there , in 1915 the governor Herbert Samuel represented a document with the title of "the future of Palestine" he said in it that the idea of making a Jewish home on this land looks perfect as it serves their interests but it can't be done without a full invasion of Britain on the land then after some years that document will turn into an obligation with the name of "Balfour promise", Now fun fact of the day : did you know that Balfour was an anti semite Christian Zionist?, Now the promise for making a home for jews wasn't clear for Britain at the time , did it mean making a country for them under Britain ruling or making a land for them and leaving , but at that time no one cared , Britain completed its plans for Jewish immigration and in the same year Britain sent military to the land and started invading al

Quds then after this filthy operation, in 1919 Harbert Samuel was assigned a leader for this operation and under his ruling he allowed 180k jews to immigrate to the land , then huge protests started in Yafa as Palestinians were getting kicked from their lands , after this violence Churchill announced a correspondence basically saying in it "I see no reason for the worry of Palestinians we came for peace", 100 years later and now you know why we were worried , btw second fun fact of the day some sources say that Churchill was antisemitic. moving to 1929 jews will start getting more violent and will arrange a prayer in the wall of Buraq , claiming their historical heritage to the land and disrespecting Muslims there, then the rebel of Buraq started and Palestinians were shocked by the amount of violence that the Britain showed they arrested hundreds , killed tens and executed the leaders of the rebellions , basically because those Europeans didn't view us as humans, Ilan pappe said that the words that Churchill and Balfour and Herbert used to describe us in their messages were arabis or Mohammadis , basically dehumanizing us like how they did with native Americans, here's a quote from Churchill calling us dogs: Winston Churchill [compares] Palestinians in 1937 to the dog in the manger after reading the Peel Commission which suggested partitioning British mandated Palestine into Arab and Jewish states. Churchill said of the Palestinians in 1937, "I do not agree that the dog in a manger has the final right to the manger even though he may have lain there for a very long time. I

do not admit that right. I do not admit for instance, that a great wrong has been done to the Red Indians of America or the black people of Australia. I do not admit that a wrong has been done to these people by the fact that a stronger race, a higher-grade race, a more worldly wise race to put it that way, has come in and taken their place". In 1935 jews percent increased from 5 percent to 27 percent this number is crazy , then after the death of Sheikh Ezz al Deen Al-Qassam the Arabic rebel started in 1936 , Britain killed 1000 Palestinian and would arrest anyone they see then explode his house, in Yafa only they bombed 200 houses , Britain gave jews a full community , they gave them land , weapon , infrastructure and fought the rebellions to the extent that in 1940 10% of Palestinian men were between dead, injured or prisoned , then jews learned colonization from Britain but there's one thing, Britain didn't think of kicking Palestinians but Zionists did as one of their most loved leaders Joseph Weitz said "there will be no land for 2 people", then the operations of kicking Palestinians from their villages started , from 1937 till 1939 Israelis started practicing terrorism, sending car bombs in Haifa and al-Quds killing around 100 Palestinian, you know what Britain did while this happened? Killed 5k Palestinian arrested 9k and increased their forces to 25k soldiers. At the start of ww2 in 1939 Britain will limit the immigration of jews to 15k as Arabs were getting furious and they couldn't focus on 2 places ,during the war 15k Israeli soldiers joined the British in ww2 to get

experience from the war in order to rule the land , and by passing of time the small terrorist Israeli groups will turn to organized military organizations after the experience they got during ww2 , like Hagannah it turned from a small group to a military with air force and after getting this strong they will start thinking "why kick Arabs why not just kill them" and that's when the general O. C. Wingate will start teaching them how to invade villages , that pig was the first person to teach them the ethnic cleansing, then they started studying the geography of those villages and started their operations, now because of ww2 Britain cant match the Zionist ambition and that's when Israelis started viewing them as an obstacle. , and the tension rose up when the French ship of Batria came to Palestine with 1800 immigrants without the permission of Britain you know what those terrorists groups did to make Britain allow them ? They bombed it and killed 240 person , you know what's more funny the shtern Zionist group had talks with hitler himself in Lebanon to provide them with weapon, this is what Eugene Rogan himself said in his book , in 1942 Israelis realized Britain is no more good so they made the Baltimore conference in USA to get their aid and they helped them till the Hagannah even had weapon factories , now Britain realized the betrayal of Zionists not only they sided with multiple random organizations but in 1946 they bombed the hotel of king Daoud the center of Britain embassy, and then the Aragon killed 91 British ppl then a ship containing 4500 refugees escaping from holocaust

came but Britain refused because it was more than the allowed then Israelis started a riot against British army and kidnapped 2 British soldiers and killed them so they executed 3 Aragon's, the leader of Aragon was Manahem Bejin That dude was wanted for multiple crimes That dude became the prime minister of Israel And won noble prize in "peace" During the last few years of the British mandate Israelis committed 500 acts of terror ,Killing 169 British, Destroying infrastructure ,Targeting banks and Creating new acts of terrorism Like mined parcels. British ppl were just fed up with Zionists that they after 2 years from fighting nazis they attacked jews in UK and raised nazi flag. what Britain did after it ? They jailed 300 Palestinians Even the Israeli author Avi Shlaim commented on it by saying that the British threw every moral concept they know to make this country be made, in 1947 when Britain threw that case to the united nations and left Israelis with weapons , money ,land , infrastructure.
